## Class of '56 Encourages Other Classes to Stay Connected With Zoom. Here's How They Do It!

Our BHS Class of '56, held its only reunion in 1997 (it was to be our 40th...but took longer to arrange than initially thought). But, years later, Ann Zimmerman, Bob Alvine, and Sal Accardo began an email chain, before holidays, wishing their small cadre of alums, Happy Thanksgiving, etc.

Then, in early 2021, the idea began to add more alums to that list, eventually growing now to 84 living classmates (and 110 found deceased), and to explore the virtual reunion idea, via Zoom. To date, we have had 7 reunions by Zoom, generally 6 months apart. A highlight of each has been to hear from a current BHS administrator or teacher to give an update as to how things are running now (principal, head football coach, drama teacher, director of bands, etc.). We even found the former band director, Ray Hartman, who was then 103 years old, who played his trombone for us.

Meetings run between 1.5 to 2 hours, folks log in and drop out as schedules allow. The most attendees we've had was 35...which required 2 screens (classmates had to switch back and forth to see everyone)

#### How We Did It

Free Zoom has a limitation of 40 minutes, and the Zoom coordinator should have a real

power of concentration to get mostly electronically-challenged 85 year olds to hear/see and to be heard/seen, plus inserting remembered (not married) names, and muting out those not speaking for optimum audio clarity. So hiring a qualified Zoom master is strongly recommended.

While there is an Agenda for structure, and Alums are admonished not to talk of ailments (we all have those) and grandkids (they all are smarter and earn far more money than we ever did), often that is the only news some seem to have to report! Structure gives way to random discussions, but that's the fun of all this: reminiscing about shared good times, teachers, dances and relationships.
